AFFIDAVIT OF DEBORAH SERAFINCHON

- I, Debornh Scrafinchen, of the City of Edmonton, in the Province of Alberta, SWEAR/AFFIRM AND SAY THAT:
- On or about December 13, 2001 Preceived the results of a DNA test I had requested to confirm that the late Chief Walter Patrick Twins was my biological father.
- Samples were provided of Lillian McDermott, my biological mother, myself, Catherine Twinn, Walter Twinn, Samuel Twinn and Issac Twinn.
- 3. Walter Twinn (also known as Patrick Twinn), Samuel Twinn and Issac Twinn are the blological children of Catherine Twinn and the late Chief Walter Patrick Twinn.
- 4. The results stated:

Assuming that Walter Twinn, Samuel Twinn, and Issae Twinn are full biological siblings, then Deborah Serafinehon cannot be excluded as their half sibling. Based on the genetic testing results obtained by DNA analysis, the probability of paternal relatedness is 99.58% as compared to an unknown, unrelated individual of the North American population (prior probability = 50%).

Attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "A" is a copy of the DNA test results I received dated December 13, 2001.

5. Based on the forgoing, I do verily believe that Chief Walter Patrick Twinn is my biological father.

DEFINITIONS OF TERMS ON DNA REPORT

♦ Locus:

The code provided refers to a specific region on a chromosome.

* Paternity Index (PI):

This value equals the liklihood that the alleged father is the father rather than any other man selected at random from the population.

 Combined Paternity Index (CPD: Since each Locus result is an independent event, the CPI is the product of all of the Indices and indicates the possibility of the alleged father being the actual father relative to that of any other man selected at random from the population. This value will either be 0 or greater than 999.

Probability of Paternity:


This value is converted from the CPI into the percentage probability = [CPI / CPI + 1] x 100.

Prior Probability= 50%:

50% is the probability of paternity prior to conducting a test. It is equivalent to flipping a coin. Either the Alleged Father is or is not the biological father. After testing however, the probability will be 0% or >99.9%.

INTERPRETATION OF RESULTS

- To interpret the results, you must look at the results of each locus combination individually. The
 result for each person consists of 1 or 2 numbers which are actually DNA variants. If there is only
 one number typed for an individual at a locus, this means the person has two identical DNA
 fragments for that chromosomal location.
- First, determine which band the mother and child share. The child's remaining band is therefore
 the paternal band. (If the mother is no rested, simply compare the child's DNA to the alleged
 father's DNA).
- The second step is to determine whether the child's paternal band, matches one of the alleged father's bands.
- 4. If there is no match, the PI for that locus will be 0.00. If there is a match, a PI will be generated (based on the alleged father's race), for that matching DNA.
- Repeat this process for each of the locus combinations.
- Once you have completed this, you must multiply the PI's together to get the CPI.
- If the CPI is 0.00, then the alleged father has been excluded as being the biological father of the child, and the Probability of Paternity is 0%.
- If the CPI is greater than 1000, this means that the alleged father cannot be excluded as the biological father, and the Probability of Paternity is then calculated from the CPI as set out above.

Examine the "non-exclusion" diagram above. The numbers in bold type show the origins of the child's DNA fragments. For Alleged Father #1, the DNA fragments 7, 16, 25 and 22 match those of the child. In this case, the Combined Paternity Index (20.833 x 8.333 x 3.876 x 35.714) is 24.031.20; therefore, Alleged Father #1 is 24.031 times more likely to be the biological father than any other man selected at random from the population. This is then calculated as a Probability of Paternity of >99.99%.



Dear «First»,

Based on extensive legal advice and negotiations with the Sawridge First Nation, the Sawridge Trusts Trustees have come to the conclusion that the provisions of the two trust documents envision that all beneficiaries of the Trusts must be Band members and that the only body able to make a determination as to who qualifies as a Band member is the Sawridge First Nation through its Chief and Council, Membership Committee and Legislative Assembly using the Membership Code established by the Sawridge First Nation.

As such, the Sawridge Trusts have decided to abandon their previous decision to appoint a tribunal to review the applications you and other persons submitted to the Trusts to be considered as beneficiaries in favour of having the Membership Committee of the Sawridge First Nation make a determination of who qualifies to be a member of the First Nation.

The definition of beneficiaries for the Sawridge Trust of 15 August 1986 is quite clear:

"Beneficiaries" at any particular time shall mean all persons who at that time qualify as members of the Sawridge Indian Band under the laws of Canada in force from time to time including, without restricting the generality of the foregoing, the membership rules and customary laws of the Sawridge Indian Band as the same may exist from time to time to the extent that such membership rules and customary laws are incorporated into, or recognized by, the laws of Canada.

Since the Sawridge First Nation has a Membership Code in force, the Trust definition of a beneficiary to the Sawridge Trust can be taken to mean "anyone who has been accepted as a member of the Sawridge First Nation according to the Membership Code".

The definition of beneficiaries for the Sawridge Intervivos Settlement of 15 April 1985, which reads:

"Beneficiaries" at any particular time shall mean all persons who at that time qualify as members of the Sawridge Indian Band No. 19 pursuant to the provisions of the Indian Act R.S.C. 1970, Chapter 1-6 as such provisions existed on the 15th day of April, 1982 and, in the event that such provisions are amended after the date of the execution

of this Deed all persons who at such particular time would qualify for membership of the Sawridge Indian Band No. 19 pursuant to the said provisions as such provisions existed on the 15th day of April, 1982 and, for greater certainty, no persons who would not qualify as members of the Sawridge Indian Band No. 19 pursuant to the said provisions, as such provisions existed on the 15th day of April, 1982, shall be regarded as "Beneficiaries" for the purpose of this Settlement whether or not such persons become or are at any time considered to be members of the Sawridge Indian Band No. 19 for all or any other purposes by virtue of amendments to the Indian Act R.S.C. 1970, Chapter 1-6 that may come into force at any time after the date of the execution of this Deed or by virtue of any other legislation enacted by the Parliament of Canada or by any province or by virtue of any regulation, Order in Council, treaty or executive act of the Government of Canada or any province or by any other means whatsoever; provided, for greater certainty, that any person who shall become enfranchised, become a member of another Indian band or in any manner voluntarily cease to be a member of the Sawridge Indian Band No 19 under the Indian Act R.S.C. 1970, Chapter 1-6, as amended from time to time, or any consolidation thereof or successor legislation thereto shall thereupon cease to be a Beneficiary for all purposes of this Settlement

is also quite clear that "beneficiaries" are clearly meant to be persons who are members of the Sawridge First Nation except for a select few who qualified as Band members under the 1982 provisions of the Indian Act but may no longer qualify under the current Act. The definition, though, refers to a section of the Indian Act that has since been repealed.

As a result of this reference to a section of the Indian Act that is no longer in force, the Trustees have decided to ask the Alberta Court to provide its advice as to whether or not this definition is still valid. All parties having an interest in this application to the Court will be notified when the application is submitted. The application is not likely to affect the requirement that, for the most part, beneficiaries must also be members of the Sawridge First Nation.

We are contacting you because you applied to be considered as a beneficiary to one or both of the Sawridge Trusts. We are now informing you that you should do the following:

Karlyn,

By the paperwork I sent you, I presume that you are referring to the Application for Potential Beneficiaries. In January of this year, I also sent out a letter to everyone who had filled out one of those applications telling them that if they wished to be considered as a beneficiary that they had to apply for Indian Status through Indian Affairs (if they hadn't done so already) and that they had to apply for membership in the Sawridge First Nation. If you haven't done that, I would suggest that you do so.

The Court process that is now underway is to get the Court's advice and direction concerning the identification of beneficiaries to the 1985 Trust. The beneficiaries to the 1986 Trust are already identified as the members of Sawridge First Nation.

The Trusts do not have individual trust funds set aside for any individual beneficiary so there would not be a fund set aside for you since, at this time, you are not one of the identified beneficiaries. Even if you were a beneficiary, there are no funds to be handed out to anyone. The Trust was set up to provide benefits and to invest money for the beneficiaries from First Nation oil revenues in the 1980s.
