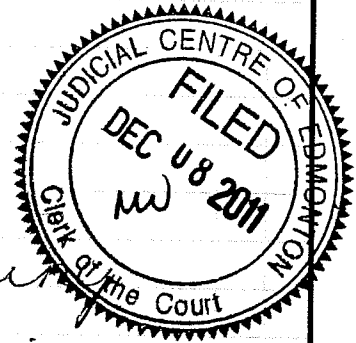

### AFFIDAVIT OF WILMA HEBERT

**Sworn on December 6, 2011**

I, Wilma Hebert of the City of Cold Lake in the Province of Alberta swear and say that:

1. I am the wife of Maurice Paul Hebert and as such have personal knowledge of the facts and matters deposed to herein except where stated to be based on information and belief.
2. My husband is recognized as a Status Indian with the Canadian Federal Government under Bill C-3. He is also a descendent of the Sawridge Band No. 454, now known as the Sawridge First Nation (hereinafter referred to as the "Sawridge First Nation" or "Nation"). He is not registered as a member of the Sawridge First Nation.

3. As a descendent of the Sawridge First Nation, this entitles my husband to the matter brought forward involving the Sawridge Band Inter Vivos Settlement created in 1985 (hereinafter called the “1985 Trust”).
4. This matter involving the 1985 Trust has been brought forward to the Court by the five trustees of the 1985 Trust: Bertha L’HIRONDELLE, Clara MIDBO, Catherine TWINN, Roland C. TWINN and Walter Felix TWIN (hereinafter referred to as the “Trustees”).
5. The Trustees are seeking the opinion, advice and direction of the Court respecting the administration and management of the property held under the 1985 Trust (hereinafter referred to as the “Advice and Direction Application” as they have expressed concerns;
  - a. Regarding the definition of “Beneficiaries” contained in the 1985 Trust;
  - b. Regarding the transfer of assets into the 1985 Trust.
6. I make this affidavit in support that as a descendent of the Sawridge First Nation my husband is a potential beneficiary to the 1985 Trust.
7. My husband is thereby also entitled to provide my opinion, advice and direction for the definition of “Beneficiaries” contained the 1985 Trust and the transfer of assets into the 1985 Trust brought forward by the Trustees in the Advice and Direction Application.
8. My husband, **Maurice Paul Hebert** was born October 6, 1950 to his mother Florence Theresa HEBERT nee MCGILLIVRAY (deceased) (hereinafter referred to as Florence McGillivray) and Marcel Alfred Hebert (deceased) of Cold Lake Alberta. He is recognized as a Status First Nation through the legislation of Bill C-3 in 2010.
9. **Florence Theresa McGillivray** (his mother) was born September 21, 1921 into the Sawridge First Nation to Caroline Mary MCGILLIVRAY nee STONEY (deceased) (hereinafter referred to as Mary Stoney – Sawridge Band member # 29) and Simon Montrose McGillivray (deceased) a half breed of Slave Lake Alberta. His mother was recognized as a Status First Nation through the legislation of Bill C-31 in 1985.
10. **Caroline Mary Stoney** (his maternal grandmother) was born September 1, 1902 into the Sawridge First Nation to Johnny STONEY (deceased) (hereinafter referred to as Johnny Stoney – Sawridge Band member # 18) and Henriette or Harriett STONEY nee CALDER (deceased) to our knowledge, was a member of the Sawridge First Nation from the Lesser Slave Lake area. His grandmother was recognized as a Status First Nation from birth until she enfranchised and married Simon McGillivray a half breed. His Grandmother would have qualified for status through Bill C-31 had she survived until then.
11. **Johnny Assiniboitis Stoney (Stony) (Stephens)** (his maternal great grandfather) Sawridge Band Member # 18 was born January 1872. He developed land before it was surveyed in 1912 and I believe was given a location ticket for NE ¼ of Section 6,


Township 73, Range 4, and North of the 5<sup>th</sup> Meridian. (Presently referred to as IR#150 G Sawridge First Nation). He died March 13, 1956.

12. It is my belief my husband is affiliated to the Sawridge First Nation as a direct descendant of Johnny Stoney Band member #18, Mary Stoney Band member #29, and his mother Florence McGillivray. Through his blood connection to their lineage I believe he is a potential beneficiary to the 1985 Trust and therefore should be included in the Advice and Direction application presented before the Court regarding the definition of the beneficiaries and the transfer of assets with the 1985 Trust.

Sworn on December 2, 2011

I, Maurice Paul Hebert of the City of Cold Lake in the Province of Alberta swear and say that:

1. I am recognized as a Status Indian with the Canadian Federal Government under Bill C-3. I am also a descendent of the Sawridge Band No. 454, now known as the Sawridge First Nation (hereinafter referred to as the "Sawridge First Nation" or "Nation"). I am not registered as a member of the Sawridge First Nation.

2. As a descendent of the Sawridge First Nation, this entitles me to the matter brought forward involving the Sawridge Band Inter Vivos Settlement created in 1985 (hereinafter called the "1985 Trust").
3. This matter involving the 1985 Trust has been brought forward to the Court by the five trustees of the 1985 Trust: Bertha L'HIRONDELLE, Clara MIDBO, Catherine TWINN, Roland C. TWINN and Walter Felix TWIN (hereinafter referred to as the "Trustees").
4. The Trustees are seeking the opinion, advice and direction of the Court respecting the administration and management of the property held under the 1985 Trust (hereinafter referred to as the "Advice and Direction Application" as they have expressed concerns;
  - a. Regarding the definition of "Beneficiaries" contained in the 1985 Trust;
  - b. Regarding the transfer of assets into the 1985 Trust.
5. I make this affidavit in support that as a descendent of the Sawridge First Nation that I am a potential beneficiary to the 1985 Trust.
6. I am thereby also entitled to provide my opinion, advice and direction for the definition of "Beneficiaries" contained the 1985 Trust and the transfer of assets into the 1985 Trust brought forward by the Trustees in the Advice and Direction Application.

#### **Background**


7. I **Maurice Paul Hebert** was born October 6, 1950 to my mother Florence Theresa **HEBERT** nee **MCGILLIVRAY** (deceased) (hereinafter referred to as Florence McGillivray) and Marcel Alfred Hebert (deceased) of Cold Lake Alberta. I am recognized as a Status First Nation through the legislation of Bill C-3 in 2010.
8. **Florence Theresa McGillivray** (my mother) was born September 21, 1921 into the Sawridge First Nation to Caroline Mary **MCGILLIVRAY** nee **STONEY** (deceased) (hereinafter referred to as Mary Stoney - Sawridge Band member # 29) and Simon Montrose McGillivray (deceased) a half breed of Slave Lake Alberta. My mother was recognized as a Status First Nation through the legislation of Bill C-31 in 1985.
9. **Caroline Mary Stoney** (my maternal grandmother) was born September 1, 1902 into the Sawridge First Nation to Johnny **STONEY** (deceased) (hereinafter referred to as Johnny Stoney - Sawridge Band member # 18) and Henriette or Harriett **STONEY** nee **CALDER** (deceased) to our knowledge, was a member of the Sawridge First Nation from the Lesser Slave Lake area. My grandmother was recognized as a Status First Nation from birth until she enfranchised and married Simon McGillivray a half breed. My Grandmother would have qualified for status through Bill C-31 had she survived until then.

10. Johnny Assiniboitis Stoney (Stony) (Stephens) (my maternal great grandfather) Sawridge Band Member # 18 was born January 1872. He developed land before it was surveyed in 1912 and we believe was given a location ticket for NE ¼ of Section 6, Township 73, Range 4, and North of the 5<sup>th</sup> Meridian. (Presently referred to as IR#150 G Sawridge First Nation). He died March 13, 1956.

**Conclusion**

11. I declare my affiliation to the Sawridge First Nation as a direct descendant of Johnny Stoney Band member #18, Mary Stoney Band member #29, and my mother Florence McGillivray, it is through my blood connection to their lineage that I consider myself a potential beneficiary to the 1985 Trust and therefore should be included in the Advice and Direction application presented before the Court regarding the definition of the beneficiaries and the transfer of assets with the 1985 Trust.
