- 3. As a descendent of the Sawridge First Nation, this entitles my husband to the matter brought forward involving the Sawridge Band Inter Vivos Settlement created in 1985 (hereinafter called the "1985 Trust").
- 4. This matter involving the 1985 Trust has been brought forward to the Court by the five trustees of the 1985 Trust: Bertha L'HIRONDELLE, Clara MIDBO, Catherine TWINN, Roland C. TWINN and Walter Felix TWIN (hereinafter referred to as the "Trustees").
- 5. The Trustees are seeking the opinion, advice and direction of the Court respecting the administration and management of the property held under the 1985 Trust (hereinafter referred to as the "Advice and Direction Application" as they have expressed concerns;
 - a. Regarding the definition of "Beneficiaries" contained in the 1985 Trust;
 - b. Regarding the transfer of assets into the 1985 Trust.
